- Crossing wooded hillsides, steep slopes, pastures, roads and streams, the pipeline would require ditches approximately 7 feet deep to house 42-inch pipes.
- A 75-foot "permanent easement" will be a clear-cut gash that fragments woods and farmland. Companies would be allowed regular access for monitoring and maintenance access; herbicidal sprays would be used to prevent re-growth along the easement.
- The proposed route comes close to homes, farms, churches, and businesses. It is only 1 mile from James Monroe High School and the Springfield Nursing Home.
- The Red Sulphur PSD reports that the route comes through a "well head protection area" and is within 1200 to 1500 feet of a zoned "critical concern source."
